

*The acclamation joyfully acknowledges God's presence and reign, announcing that we gather at his invitation and under his authority.

*This ancient prayer asks the Holy Spirit to cleanse our hearts so we may love God and magnify his Name with grace only he provides. *The Ten Commandments, or Decalogue, reveal God's holiness and our sin. In Christ they guide grateful obedience. As Psalm 119 declares, God's commands light our path.

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION OF SIN*

Please kneel and silently confess your sins against God and your neighbor.

Most merciful God,

we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*Added in the English Reformation, these sentences of Scripture assure repentant sinners of Christ's mercy and remind us that our confidence rests in his finished work alone.

A COLLECT FOR CHILDREN

Almighty God, heavenly Father, you have blessed our congregation with the joy and care of children: Give us courage, patience, and wisdom, as we bring them up in the faith, that they may never know a day apart from your love and care; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE SERMON

*The Creed unites us with the Church across time, faithfully summarizing Scripture and guarding the gospel as we confess one Lord, one faith, one hope.

THE NICENE CREED* We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, visible and invisible. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures: he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic* and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

*Intercessory prayer is the priestly task of the people of God. Because Christ intercedes for us, we bring the needs of Church, world, and neighbor to the Father who delights to give good gifts.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE*

Lord in your mercy **Hear our prayer.**

*Sharing peace declares Christ's finished reconciliation. Before Communion, we express gospel unity: those at peace with God live at peace with one another.

CELEBRATING THE LORD'S SUPPER

God welcomes his people to feast at his table. This meal, a means of grace for all who receive by faith, is a rehearsal of the central act of the Christian faith: Christ's death on the cross — his body broken and his blood shed as a sacrifice for our sins.

*Sursum Corda means "Lift up your hearts." By the Spirit we celebrate and remember the oncefor-all offering Christ our ascended high priest offers to the Father on our behalf.

SURSUM CORDA*

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION*

*Consecration is when God uses ordinary means—bread, and wine—to communicate extraordinary grace. We ask the Spirit to set apart these gifts, not by altering their substance, but by using them to unite us to Christ in faith.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

*The Fraction is the breaking of the consecrated bread, recalling Christ's body broken for us. It is a visible sign that the benefits of his finished work are freely given to believers through

THE FRACTION*

Alleluia. Christ our Passover Lamb has been sacrificed, once and for all upon the Cross.

Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

THE DISTRIBUTION

All baptized Christians who come with faith in Christ and repentance for sin are welcome to share in this feast. If for any reason you would prefer to abstain, cross your arms over your chest, and one of the servers will pray a blessing for you.

Come forward to receive communion row by row. If you do not wish to drink from the common cup, take a small cup at the front of the aisle as you go forward. When arriving at the front of the communion line, place your hands in front of you to receive a piece of bread, and consume it. After receiving the bread, proceed to the first server to take a drink from the common cup (please do not dip your bread) or to the second server with your plastic cup to receive a pour of wine. Grape juice is available at the far right station and is available poured only.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

All children's ministry is staffed by trained and screened volunteers.

Nursery: Also open for parents/caretakers and infants, anytime during the service for nursing or fussy babies. Located upstairs, midway down the hall to your left. Available throughout the service. You can bring your child prior to the service. Pickup at the Peace.

Toddler Room: For steady walkers up to 3 years old. Located upstairs; last classroom on the right. Check-in located outside the classroom. You can bring your child prior to the service. Pickup at the Peace.
